

Notes and Regulations.

Preachers.—Each Preacher is earnestly requested to attend his own appointments punctually and conscientiously; and when personal attendance is impossible, must get a supply, and not write to the Ministers. *An accredited Preacher is expected to find a substitute of equal position.* Nothing is more injurious to our Societies than the neglect of appointments.

No person whose name is not on the Plan, nor approved by the Circuit Authorities, is allowed to officiate at any of our Services.

Candidates must possess suitable gifts and graces and interested loyalty to our connexional claims and work.

Local Preachers on Trial are expected to study the following books and be examined thereon:—Townsend's Handbook of Christian Doctrine; Clapperton's Manual for Local Preachers; Robertson's Old Testament and its Contents; Currie Martin's Books of the New Testament; Kendall's Primitive Methodist Church Principles, History and Polity; Stewart's Handbook of Christian Evidences; Micklejohn's Short English Grammar.

Society Stewards: Their duties.—1. To furnish the pulpit with a written notice of everything to be published the Sabbath before it takes place. 2. To make all preparations for Public Meetings, and prepare for Sacraments and Lovefeasts. 3. To see that all collections are made according to Plan, and take charge of all moneys for circuit purposes, and cause the same to be forthcoming at the commencement of the Quarterly Meeting.

N.B.—Collections are taken at each service and must be devoted to the Circuit Fund, unless otherwise sanctioned by order or on behalf of the Quarterly Meeting according to Rule.

Members.—Persons wishing to join our Church are desired to apply to the Ministers or Class Leader. All members are urged to attend Divine Worship regularly and punctually, to be present at the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, and to attend the week-night services and class meetings as frequently as possible, to pay their class money or contributions weekly, and to support the Church funds as liberally as their circumstances permit. They must not take any steps to get up tea meetings without the sanction of the Circuit Committee or Quarterly Meeting. In cases of sickness or trouble where special visitation is needed, prompt information should be given to the Ministers. When members or adherents remove, they should inform the Ministers or Class Leader of their new address, so that credentials may be forwarded at once to the nearest P.M. Church.

BAPTISMS.—Parents having their children baptized by our Ministers, are requested to attend the ordinance, and receive a Certificate of Baptism, for which sevenpence will be charged.

MARRIAGES.—Dereham, Mattishall, Sparham, Lyng, North Tuddenham, Swanton, Billingford, Reepham, Hockering, Shipdham, and Garvestone Chapels are Registered for the Solemnization of Marriages. For particulars, apply to one of the Ministers.

BURIALS.—By the Burial Laws Amendment Act, 1880, our own Ministers are at liberty to conduct the service in any churchyard upon forty-eight hours notice being given to the clergyman of the parish, signed by relatives, friends, or legal representatives of the person deceased, and endorsed on the outside "Notice of Burial." The legal forms may be procured gratis of the Ministers.
