Preachers' References.

1. N.B.—Every Preacher is expected to attend to his own appointment, or, if unavoidably prevented, himself to procure an accredited substitute, or write the Society Steward in good time.

2. No Preacher's appointment to be altered without his consent.

3. All Preachers must be Members of a Christian Church.

4. By decision of Preachers' Meeting, all candidates for the Plan are expected to be Total Abstinents.

5. Conference recommends that the examination for Preachers on Trial be taken in four stages, as follows:—

(A). The Life and Teaching of Christ. Text Books, Gospel of Matthew and Stalker's Life.

(B). The Life and Teaching of Paul. Text Books, Stalker's Life of Paul and the Epistle to the Philippians.

(C). The History of the Old Testament. Text Book, Jefferies' "Growth of the Old Testament."

(D). Christian Theology. Text Book, "What a Christian Believes, and Why?" Selected portions.

These stages may be taken at the convenience of the local preacher, quarterly or half-yearly, and the examination at each stage be oral or written, as the candidate may desire.
